Whether you are in Tomahawk, Rhinelander, Merrill, Antigo or Wausau, the rural setting of Gleason's Club X to C is only a short drive. Located just 10 miles west of

Merrill, X to C is a full service family restaurant with a full bar and a golf course.

The restaurant's house speciality is broasted chicken. Friday offers "all you can eat" fish, shrimp and chicken meals. The Saturday and Sunday special is prime rib of beef. The menu includes rib eye and tenderloin steaks, pork chops, fettuccini alfredo, deep fried or pan broiled walleye, shrimp as well as sandwiches. Don't forget to start with a plate of our famous homemade haystack style onion rings and finish with a homemade dessert.

Restaurant hours are 3 p.m. - 10 p.m. daily from May through September with meals starting at 11 a.m. on Sundays. During the winter months, the restaurant is closed on Tuesdays and serves only until 9 p.m.

The bar is a full service bar, which also serves as the clubhouse for the golf course. There you can get a sandwich lunch daily during golf season or a cup of homemade soup with a chilled mug of your favorite beverage. Casual dress and a relaxed atmosphere make it a comfortable place to sit back and enjoy your favorite golf pro on tour, a Nascar race, or a ball game on HD flat screens. Also visit our pro shop for all your golfing needs.

The golf course is a par 33 executive course. What it lacks in length, it gains in challenge. One of the three par-3 holes sports a four-foot raised course to walk, but riding carts are available as well as pull carts and rental clubs. We do not take tee times and are on a first come, first golf basis. It is always a good idea to call to see if there is a course closure or an outing scheduled the day you plan to golf.
